## President's Report

No report received.

## Treasurer's Report

With our appointed Treasurer, Dee Norris, not being able to fulfil the treasurer role towards the end of the season the committee sought the assistance of Brydie Bodnar (long standing club member and previous treasurer). In true Brydie fashion she was happy to help consolidate the income and expenses and pull together the financial statements for 2010.

One of the big challenges that still faces BHC is the transparency in money handling (it changes hands a number of times, through our managers, coordinators, committee members etc, before it's banked). With the introduction of direct deposits over the internet, this has improved our banking significantly. However we still had thousands of dollars deposited without any name or payment reference and without any notification to the treasurer or team manager etc. which is a huge hassle to chase up.

We've also identified improvements in the transparency of issuing volunteer / fundraising discounts. In 2011 this model will be refined to incorporate a cheque refund, for the advertised amount, upon completion of the volunteer/fundraising duties. There are other improvements we're going to implement too, like encouraging more people to do electronic funds transfers, using triplicate receipting books (so you get a piece of paper in your hand when you pay for something), improving communications on fee payment due by dates, and helping coaches and managers enforce the "no pay, no play" rule that BHC has had for years now.

In terms of our financial performance in 2010, the Financial Statement indicates that we had a net expenditure of \$7,098 (compared with a net income of \$8,779 in 2009). A few factors contributed to this:

- 2010 total fees incoming remained around the same as 2009, despite the higher number of club members. This was due to the introduction of greater volunteer discount incentives in 2010 compared with 2009.
- Fundraising was down on 2009 owing to fewer bunnings sausage sizzles and less focus on fundraising during 2010 (more on volunteering). Some fundraising monies from 2010 was also banked after the end of our financial year (bunnings \$1800, chocolates still coming in).



- BHC didn't apply for, or receive any, grant funding during 2010 so income from this was down. The \$6,600 grant funding income we received in 2009 wasn't paid during 2009, it was paid in January 2010.
- Approximately \$2500 fees was yet to be received as at 30 September 2010.

Our biggest expense is IHA fees, including turf hire for training and games, umpiring and canteen duty. BHC organised additional turf time at IHA in 2010 to accommodate the increase in U15 and senior teams (\$12k more than 2009, with additional fees paid during October 2010). BHC also paid the 2009 and 2010 Bellbowrie Sports and Rec Club Fees during 2010 (owing to late billing by BSRC).

Overall the club remains in a good financial position. The focus of the new treasurer will be to develop the 2011 budget early, in consultation with the management committee, and establish volunteer discounts and incentives that are within our club's financial capacity and that also enable us to deliver the operational activities (skills development sessions) that will occur in 2011.

## Hook In2 Hockey Report

This season started with a different format organised by the then current RCD, with 5-6 weeks of skills work on Saturday mornings for 1 hour, then the young players moved into some impromptu quarter field games to introduce game play. The games were a big hit with the children. The season for the Hin2H players was also extended this year, to be closer to the season for other junior games, finishing just before the junior finals.



Bellbowrie registered 21 players this season, some new and some from previous years. We continued our 1 hour training seasons on Thursday nights, at the Bellbowrie Sport and Recreation Club grounds, where we had about 12 regulars turning up. These sessions were some skills and then some quarter field games and as much fun as possible.

We also had some of the E grade Boys from the IHA Combo's team join in as part of their training. Three of the boys (Dan, Brad and Reece) from Hin2H played regularly for the Combo's team for the whole season, where they enjoyed the challenge of a full size field. Two of our girls (Talia and Kiera) also helped out on the Bellbowrie E grade girls team.



I would like to thank those club members who helped out on Thursday & Saturday sessions:

- Rachael Kelly and Elena Moser assisted with the coaching at Thursday nights training, the kids enjoyed the challenge of trying to take the ball off Rachael or trying to catch Elena when she ran the ball up the field.
- Nicole Dent & Michelle Ballaren who looked after our young players on Saturday mornings and Ross Hocking who helped out as the coordinator for the Hin2H players and Julie Ellett who helped with all the organising.
- There were also some other club members who helped out when needed from time to time and this was greatly appreciated by all involved.

Without these people lending their time the children would have had a poorer experience of playing hockey.

The Hin2H program again this year provided both boys & girls players to support both our boys and girls E grade teams. Quite a few Hin2H players are also playing in BHC's two U11yr Indoor Hockey teams, gaining some more experience in actual umpired games.

The Hin2H program over the last 3-4 years has provided BHC with a good source of younger players for our E grade teams. As proof of the success of the program we now have quite a few players still playing in u11 & u13 teams who started in Hin2H a few years ago.

## Junior Girls Coordinator Report

Well done Bellbowrie girls! Wow!!!!!! What a season. What a privilege it is, to be involved with such a fantastic group of girls.

2010 saw Bellbowrie Hockey Club take out the premiership in both the under 15 girls' and under 13 girls' competitions, with the under 11 girls finishing in 3<sup>rd</sup> position after a close match against Collegians in the preliminary final. In 2009 BHC's two under 15 teams finished 2nd and 3rd, the two under 13 teams finished 3rd and 7th and the under 11 girls finished in 5th position.

The success of the 2009 season was reaffirmed by the number of girls who returned to the club in 2010. There were only a couple of girls from each of the five teams fielded in 2009 who did not return. 16 of the girls who played in the under 15 teams in 2009 returned to play senior hockey in 2010. For many girls it is a big leap from junior to senior hockey and the number of BHC girls making that leap is increasing each year. This bodes well for the future of the senior club.

Of the 47 junior girls registered with BHC, 15 were new to the club in 2010. With the publicity that the sport of hockey has gained through the recent success of Australian teams at the Commonwealth Games, I believe that we can expect even greater growth in 2011.

BHC was, yet again, well represented in Ipswich Representative teams in 2010 and in the Metwest schoolgirls teams which played in the Under 12 and Under 19 Queensland Schoolgirls' Championships.

Over the last four years a growing number of the junior girls and boys from BHC have been entering teams in the Brisbane Indoor Hockey Association summer competition. Whilst not strictly a BHC activity, these teams have been organised by BHC parents and the indoor hockey experience has proven to be an excellent opportunity for the development of confidence and skills on the hockey field. This summer there are six Bellbowrie teams competing in the junior divisions of the indoor competition.

### E Grade – Under 11

Coach: Emily Bellingham, Manager: Sue Foran

This team began the season with six members from last year's team and six new players. Shayde joined the team early in the season, followed by Mikhaela midseason. With a couple of players away for extended holidays, then Ashleigh and Olivia breaking bones while on holidays, the girls were lucky to have Natalie join the team for Sunday matches. HookIn2 Hockey players Talicia and Kiera became regulars by the end of the season bringing the team total to 17. The team was in second position for most of the season and should be very proud to have made the finals and finished in third position. This was a very enthusiastic and determined group of girls who had a lot of fun playing hockey. Training was well attended and there was a great improvement in skills throughout the season.

Made up of six players from the 2009 teams, five girls who had been in the under 11 team in 2009 and three new players, this team was able to hold on to first position on the ladder for most of the season. The new girls learned quickly and reaped the benefits of playing with some very experienced players and some very determined players. Gen joined the team midseason, making the team number 15. Training was always well attended and while spirits may have fluctuated throughout the season, the hunger to succeed was always present. A celebratory dinner at Sizzlers' following the preliminary final win against Hancocks was organised at the last minute and attended by all 15 girls. The camaraderie was sealed the girls went out and played an amazing match against Thistles Purple in the Grand Final the next week. What an exciting game! The score was 1 – 1 at full time and drop-offs continued until the teams were playing 5-a-side. After almost 5 minutes at 5-a-side, Courtney scored to secure the premiership. A well deserved win to a champion team!

## **Junior Boys Coordinator Report**

The beginning of the season started with the aim that Bellbowrie could register teams in all 3 boy's age grades in the Ipswich competition, but a few weeks on from Sign-On day it was apparent this wasn't going to happen. We lost about 6 E grade boys to other sports and this curtailed any chance of registering an E grade team.

The club picked up some new players, consisting of some from other clubs and some new to playing hockey. In the fall out for player numbers, quite a few E grade boys played D grade and some D graders played C grade. The same old story for Hockey, we struggle to get the numbers for boys in this sport.

The D grade was the healthiest for numbers running a regular squad of 15 players. The C grade side only had 9 registered players at the start of the season, dropped to 8 due to IHA rulings and finished the season with 10 which included a new to hockey player D grade boy and a regular D grade boy filling the 11th position on the team under exemption rules from IHA.

Our few remaining E grade players and some of those E graders playing D grade joined forces and played in the Norths "Combo" E grade Team. During the season we had a total of 7 Bellbowrie



players supporting the Combo's team, more importantly we were able to keep them playing hockey and registered with the Bellbowrie Club.

This season started out like any other season for the boys but quickly got complicated with Bylaw 3.10 & exemptions being organised for Hin2H to play E grade, E grade players to play E & D games, D grade players playing C grade and a few C grade boys playing Reserve grade plus 2 C grade boys being dual registered with a club in Brisbane. The boys as a whole played a huge amount of extra games this year, just supporting the next higher age grade week in week out and demonstrated how much they enjoyed there hockey as well as tirelessly supported the club with there enthusiasm.

To highlight this effort the junior boys played a total of 145 games in higher grades. i.e. Hin2H 31 subs, E Grade 30 subs, D grade 65 subs, C grade 19 subs.

The boys deserve a huge congratulations on there efforts this year with all 3 teams making the final four teams, 2 teams E & D making the Grand finals as runners up and a 3rd for the C grade team.

### Bellbowrie E Grade (U11) Boys Report



The season started with the E grade competition in some jeopardy with only 3 teams nominated, but Norths and the IHA asked for any players available to play in a Combos team, with 3 clubs forming the team, Norths, Bremer & Bellbowrie. So the boys 4 E graders, and 3 Hin2H boys joined the team and played a high percentage of games for the Combo's. They trained separately through out the year and finished in 2nd position. The first semi final was played and the Combos won a close game over Hancock Blue 2-1 and went straight into the grand final game, so for those 2 weeks the boys got together and trained as a team for the Grand Final. Grand Final day was another close game against Hancock Blue and the boys finished runners up, going down 4-3 in the end.



I think most parents were surprised by the results of this throw together team, as it finished so strongly making it to the Grand Final.



We must thank Norths Club for getting the Combo's team up and running and there Coaches and Managers Steven and Ryan for making all the boys comfortable in the team and in the end having a very successful season playing hockey.

This mixture of young, experienced and two new players (Fred & Robbie) all the more demonstrates how the boys improved throughout the season to finish runners up.

To Mark, Manager of the D grade boys & Jane, Manager of the C grade boys, thankyou for keeping the paperwork happening, the Cards filled out and the boys patched up throughout the 2010 season.

Finally to our Supporters, Mums, Dads, Family members and Friends, thank you for loudly supporting the boys throughout the season, and thank you for your fair minded and respectful conduct on the side of the field, it is always appreciated.

### What next for 2011 season?

The first goal is still to work towards the boys registering teams in all 3 age grades as soon as possible and then sustaining those play numbers. 2011 season is looking good for achieving this, but boys have such a large variety of winter sports to choose from, you can never be confident.

The Hooked into Hockey program has rewarded this club with a reasonable flow of new players into the junior teams and a good percentage have continued on playing hockey with this club. This is an area the club needs to focus on more strongly in future years as it has been paying dividends for a reliable source for new young players and also other family members joining the club.

One of the other pressing issues is the big jump that u15's C grade boys are expected to take to move up and play in the senior mens competition. The problem of physical size, skills & maturity need to be addressed, otherwise I can fore see a clear departure of players to the Brisbane J17's comp for some of our boys in 2012. I have a few ideas I wish to explore and put to the IHA/Clubs or how this club should address the issue in 2012 when the majority of the current u15 boys are to old for Ipswich juniors.



The other concern is the dwindling numbers of boys playing hockey each year in the Ipswich competition, with only 4 teams in E & D grade and 5 in C grade, some strategies need to be pursued to add some more players/teams and variety to the competition so situations like this year with E grade doesn't become a regular occurrence and the competition doesn't stagnate.

One would think at the grass roots "Hockey Clubs" would see a flow on effect of children interested in playing hockey after the huge success of the Men and Womens Hockey teams this year. Perhaps 2011 we may see increase and the next Olympic year gain more of a boost. Media plays such a big role here.

## Senior Womens Coordinator Report

With more than a dozen of our junior girls from 2009 entering senior grades BHC fielded five women's teams in 2010. Our pre-season fitness started well but our turf training was hampered a little by the field upgrading works taking place at IHA prior to the start of the season.

Although none of our senior women's teams made semi finals this year most coaches were able to tell their teams (genuinely) that they played well. Bellbowrie was well presented in the IHA player of the year finalists across all grades, and we had a number of our U18 players selected to Ipswich representative squads.

On the club administration side, 2010 saw a changed committee structure, additional volunteer rewards and we learnt a lot about what key roles are important to the doing end of our club. One of the management committee's focus areas during 2010 was to increase the number of volunteers helping out with running of the club. A huge thank you to all the women, their parents, partners and kids who helped out with fundraising, fitness training and volunteering during 2010. Thankyou also to those volunteers who rocked up to our workshops / feedback sessions to brainstorm ideas for improvement.

The committee is still tweaking things and trying to get a structure right where we can have many small roles and more volunteers to take on these roles (lead by a good communication system and simple procedures of course). One club member summed it up perfectly in saying "Bellbowrie has done great work in developing the label, now it's time to develop the product". That's exactly what 2011 will focus on – delivering improvements to our core business: hockey.

To facilitate this the BHC management committee are introducing an "operations" sub committee where the focus is on delivering the training, equipment and specialist coaches to provide what the players, coaches and teams need to improve. With the new fields at IHA available from word go in 2011, specialist junior and senior training sessions (for field players and goalies) will be able to occur either pre-season or during the season.

Incorporating some other lessons learnt from 2010, squad training sessions and trials for the top, middle and social orders will also be able to commence early at IHA. A Selection Panel (that includes the squad coaches and at least one independent selector) will be appointed in order to ensure players are selected fairly and transparently in accordance with the 2011 Selection Policy.

It's going to be a great year, but as always – we need volunteers to help out (and we still need a women's coordinator). I'll hopefully still be helping out but focusing on improving the development and implementation of our club policies and procedures rather than player / team stuff.

I can't wait for the hockey to begin again! *GO BELLBOWRIE !!!!!*
